This workshop will teach you how to prioritize and assess problem behaviors with a focus on implementing proactive strategies to ensure student success.

### Making Progress: Teaching Strategies for Students with ASD

Participants will learn and practice a variety of methods for teaching new skills to learners with special needs, including discrete trial instruction, incidental teaching and task analysis.

### Developing Play and Social Skills

This workshop will give an overview of a variety of methods to teach play and social skills to preschool and elementary-age children with autism, including photographic activity schedules, video modeling, facilitating peer models and reverse integration.
